The Big Stone City council met in regular session on Monday July 12, 2021 meeting began at 6:30 p.m. with Mayor Athey presiding. Roll Call: Roscoe, Stoddard, Brown, Rabe and Redfield present. Mayor Athey read aloud a letter from councilman Gary Longhenry to the board and the public. Longhenry has resigned his duties as councilman effective immediately.

Bid hearing for the city Dodge Durango 2006, was announced by Mayor Athey. There were 3 bids for the vehicle. A motion was to accept the highest bid of \$752 from Monty Athey by Roscoe and seconded by Stoddard. All in favor. Motion carried.

A public hearing was held for a variance for William Wright Jr at 1230 Travelers Ave, lots 3,4,5. Variance is to place a new 22' travel trailer on the lots during the summer months(May-Oct). Sheriff Deputy Ryan Bakeberg gave the following report for June: Hours worked within city: 98 hours. Responded to suspicious activity, traffic complaint, assault investigation, dog complaint, hit and run accident, eviction notice, medical call, welfare check. 6 traffic warnings and 3 traffic citation.

Deb Wiik addressed the public about questions revolving around the Chautauqua Park Project. Greg Maag from first district was present to answer questions and explain where the project is at and what it hopes to accomplish. According to Maag the city must get an updated cost estimate to move further to phase one of the project and more information will be available after doing so. After discussion, city council agreed to first get a quote on what it will cost the city to run an estimated cost before committing. Councilmen Rabe has taken initiative to reach out to Bollig. Decision to move forward to phase one will be decided at the next meeting.

A motion to accept seconding reading of ordinance 2021-07 was made by Redfield and seconded by Stoddard. All in favor. Motion carried.

A motion to accept seconding reading of ordinance 2021-08 was made by Roscoe and seconded by Brown. All in favor. Motion carried.

Temporary ordinance regarding the issuance of local medical cannabis establishment permits and/or licenses. A motion to accept to have the first reading was made by Redfield and seconded by Brown. All in favor. Motion carried.

A motion to table Insurance Solutions umbrella policy for the city and to increase the property value of the Fire Department until next meeting was made by Rabe and seconded Stoddard. All in favor. Motion Carried.

Being no further business a motion to adjourn regular session and go into executive session was made by Redfield and seconded by Brown. All in favor, motion carried.
