Motion to pay the presented claims was made by Henderson and seconded by Hanson. Voting in favor: Hanson, Rabe, Gulley, Henderson and Baerwaldt. Motion carried.

Mary Smithwick from Big Rock Grill attended the meeting to follow up on if the Council had made a decision on giving the Big Rock Grill a liquor license. Resolution 2012-03 states that the City of Big Stone City will allow for only one On Sale and one Off Sale Liquor license and shall be issued to the Big Stone City Municipal Liquor Store. The Council asked Mary several questions and she answered them. They are concerned that the owners of the building, Hank and Dorothy Harms currently hold the Malt Beverage license and the Wine license, questioning why they hold those licenses and why Mary would hold the liquor license. After a lengthy discussion, no action was taken until the Council has more information.

The City received the updated water contract from the City of Ortonville. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided that the City would sign the contract in order to move forward. A motion was made by Gulley to sign the Water Purchase Agreement between the City of Ortonville and the City of Big Stone City. Motion was seconded by Henderson. Voting in favor: Rabe Baerwaldt, Gulley, and Henderson. Voting against: Hanson. Motion carried.

The Council discussed the Water Billing Dispute Agreement from the City of Ortonville. After a brief discussion, a motion was made by Hanson to sign the agreement. Motion was seconded by Rabe. Voting in favor: Rabe, Hanson, Henderson, Baerwaldt, and Gulley. Motion carried.

The City received a Distribution Maintenance Supplemental Service Agreement from Missouri Basin Municipal Agency d/b/a Missouri River Energy Service (MRES). Mr. Coester has been working with MRES on the agreement. He recommended the City not sign the agreement at this time. A motion was made by Henderson and seconded by Gulley to table the final decision on the agreement. All in favor, motion carried.

Councilman Gulley would like to start doing testing on the water in the Big Stone City area and check on pricing for equipment. A motion was made by Henderson and seconded by Rabe to have Gulley move forward with this action. Voting in favor: Hanson, Baerwaldt, Henderson, Rabe and Gulley. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Henderson and seconded by Gulley to nominate TJ Rabe as President of the new council. Voting in favor: Henderson, Gulley, Hanson, and Baerwaldt. Voting against: Rabe. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Henderson and seconded by Gulley to nominate Rob Baerwaldt as Vice-President of the new council. Voting in favor: Henderson, Gulley, Hanson, and Rabe. Voting against: Baerwaldt. Motion carried.

Mayor Wiik made the following appointments: Finance Officer – Donna Van Hout, Police Chief – Robert Goergen, City Attorney – William Coester, Zoning Administration Official – Robert Athey. A motion was made by Hanson and seconded by Henderson to approve the Mayor's appointment of officials. Motion carried.

Bridge Reinspectin
Program Resolution
For use with SDDOT retainer Contracts

<u>WHEREAS</u>, Title 23, Section 151, United States Code and Title 23, Part 650, Subpart C, Code of Federal Regulations, requires initial inspection of all bridges and reinspection at intervals not to exceed two years with the exception of reinforced concrete box culverts that meet specific criteria. These culverts are reinspected at intervals not to exceed four years.

<u>THEREFORE</u>, the City of Big stone City is desirous of participating in the Bridge Inspection Program using Bridge Replacement funds.

The City requests SDDOT to hire Banner for the inspection work. SDDOT will secure Federal approvals, make payments to the Consulting Engineer for inspection services rendered, and bill the City for 20% of the cost. The City will be responsible for the required 20% matching funds.
